

for over 30 years. Selected as touring artists by the Virginia Commission for the Arts, the Carys have performed at the Kennedy Center, Monticello, and Easter at the White House.

concert program:

This concert/lecture program features a short concert of world folk music. Kim & Jimbo play mandolin, banjo, fiddle, guitar, jawharp, bones and more during their world folk music performances. Kim & Jimbo's introductory set of music will feature a Tibetan welcome song, a Scotch-Irish hoedown on jawharp, string music from Mexico, an East European klezmer medley, and a West African dance tune with balafon accompaniment (Malian xylophones with gourd resonators).

lecture/demonstration workshop:

Following the concert, the Carys will demonstrate techniques for involving participants in the music making process. Parents, educators and children of all ages are welcome to attend. They will offer techniques for creating your own musical compositions such as "embroidery" which demonstrates weaving a tapestry of sound with world percussion instruments and fosters listening skills. They will also demonstrate the use of a "homemade card deck" containing various instructions to use as inspiration in the music making process with groups.

The Carys will bring their "traveling music museum" - a collection of instruments including gourds, washboards, bones, agogo bells, tambourines and hand drums. As time allows, the Carys will also display some of the homemade instruments and demonstrate techniques for making instruments from bamboo, gourds, bones, and other natural materials.
